What is Revenue Protection in the Energy Industry

- □ Revenue Protection (RP) identifying and reducing avoidable financial losses in the energy supply chain
- □£400m energy stolen per year in the UK –

3rd used to cultivate cannabis

- □Customers ultimately pay for these illegal activities
- □Combating illegal acts
- ■Worldwide problem

Who are we?























- Providing low cost housing within the NW Region
- Operates in around 30 local authorities across the NW
- Projected turnover this year is £150million
- Employ 1,051 staff
- Symphony HG is the **ninth** largest housing group in the country
- Largest housing association based solely in the NW
- Manage 43,000 properties in total



The Initiatives

- 2012 Communal Fire call 11.00 pm
 - ▶ £3,000 damage
 - No appreciation of the fire risks within the sector seen as a utility problem
 - Up skilled and understanding of the fire implications and a required focus required
- LHT staff and contractors regular and local contact
- Developed a training package for all front line staff and contractors
 200 staff delivered in 1 month
 - How meters can be by-passed and what to look for
 - The dangers and implications
 - What action to take reporting protocol?
- Raised awareness and sought to promote the dangers to others







UKRPA

- ► LHT receive support from the UKRPA
 - Supported by energy providers
 - Appreciation of the wider context and implications
- Worked to introduce a interoperability protocol
 - Operating protocol
 - Key Contacts
 - Sharing information (within DPA)
 - Service level agreement
 - Escalation procedures (support)
- ▶ Signed in September 2013



The Impact

(case study)

- 2012 Pre Launch
 - Not seen as a landlord problem
 - '0' cases identified
 - ▶ No understanding/recording of instances
 - None/limited action taken agonst tenants
- > 2013 post Launch (less than C months)
 - Considered tibe on the increase given welfare reforms and energy prices.
 - ▶ 200 -Staff / can lactors awareness (EYES AND EARS)
 - ▶ 12 Case Cantified 3 linked to small low level cannabis farms
 - Action taken under the tenancy agreement -eviction







The Potential (Pro-Rata Evaluation)

- > 3,700,000 Social Rented Homes in the UK
- ► LHT Case Study (Year 1)
 - ► Number of Units -10,000
 - ▶ 12 cases found following the training (there must be more)
 - 3 relating to small cannabis farms
 - ▶ Ratio scaled to 10,000 homes 0.0011% fraud evident
- > 3,700,000 X 0,0011 = **4070** cases nationally
 - ▶ 1117 Cannabis Farms could to removed within 1 year





Delivering Nationally

- ▶ 1,100 Federation Housing member organisations
 - Interoperability seeking endorsement by National Housing Federation (NW)
 - Interoperability Protocol to be signed by all housing organisations
 - ► Training for all front line staff and contractors
- Aim to expand nationally
